This London Safeguarding Children Board conference will give delegates a unique opportunity to gain a better understanding of the issues around Female Genital Mutilation; how care professionals have overcome challenges around engagement and are successfully working with local communities to protect children and young people; and how social care and health professionals, the police, voluntary agencies and community groups can work together to better support individuals and communities in relation to FGM.
