

Female Genital Mutilation: Awareness and management in the UK

The Florence Nightingale School of Nursing and Midwifery at King's College London with its partner Guy's & St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust have spearheaded the development of a FGM module. This new module aims to enable health care practitioners to frame FGM as a women's health issue and to develop the appropriate skills, sensitivity and cultural competence to address the needs of affected women and girls.

Module information

The module will provide a theoretical and practical base to broaden and deepen knowledge of FGM. It will equip health care professionals with the skills necessary to provide appropriate care, support, information, advice and counselling to women with FGM. Students on the module will be invited to attend on a selected day The African Well Women's Clinic, Guy's & St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust for clinical experiences. The assessment of the module consists of an academic-based objective structured clinical examination (OSCE).
